Greg Patton enters his 14th season at the helm of the Boise State University men's tennis program. Patton has led the Broncos to five consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and four WAC titles since the beginning of his second tenure in 2003. The Broncos also captured a newly added regular season WAC Championship during the 2009 season.

While successfully leading the Broncos program for 13 seasons, Patton has captured many individual honors including being inducted to the Boise State University Athletic Hall of Fame (2001), NCAA National Coach of the Year (1997), Intercollegiate Tennis Association Region Coach of the Year (1994, 1997, 2004), WAC Coach of the Year (2004-07, 2009), Big West Coach of the Year (1997) and Big Sky Coach of the Year (1993-96).

CARDIO TENNIS FOR KIDS

The official debut of Cardio Tennis for Kids (CT4Kids) will take place February 18, 2010, at the PTR International Tennis Symposium on Hilton Head Island, S.C. Cardio Tennis for Kids will invigorate children's tennis programming with an emphasis on play, fun and fitness and will provide an option to help fight childhood obesity. The three hour CT4Kids workshop will be conducted Michele Krause, National Cardio Tennis Program Manager, and members of the National Cardio Tennis Speakers Team. The workshop will consist of both classroom and on court education.

Cardio Tennis for Kids is a group play activity featuring action based tennis drills and games for children ages 6-12 of all ability levels. CT4Kids emphasizes movement and fun using music and pedometers. Using age appropriate equipment, the CT4kids environment develops tennis and athletic skills and improves health and fitness. CT4Kids is a great complement to QuickStart and PTR Kids Tennis and can be incorporated into a club's current junior programming. Since kids are not small adults and have underdeveloped cooling systems, 15-20 minutes of Cardio can be sufficient. A CT4Kids class is similar to adult Cardio Tennis in that it includes a warm up, cardio and cool down portions.

Attendees will learn why Cardio Tennis for Kids is important, as well as appropriate age groups, heart rate training, the use of pedometers, music and other tools, drills and games, and how to market a CT4Kids Program. ATP AWARDS TOURNAMENT SANCTION TO ATLANTA

On December 17, 2009, the ATP formally awarded an ATP 250 sanction to the USTA Southern Section.

The tournament, set for July 19-25, 2010, will serve as the kick-off to the 2010 Olympus US Open Series. Last month, the ATP board voted to buy the Indianapolis sanction under rules which allowed the ATP to match any offer made for the event. The board made this decision with a view to the long-term ATP calendar and to maintain its ability to address issues relating to the length of the season in the future. After positive discussions between the ATP and USTA, the ATP board became comfortable that it could meet this goal, while at the same time awarding the tournament to Atlanta and USTA Southern Section under mutually acceptable terms.

“This is a great win for the parties involved and is a wonderful example of cooperation and understanding between different authorities in tennis coming together to achieve the common goal of promoting and developing tennis in the United States,” said Mark Young, the ATP Chief Executive Officer for the Americas. “We at the ATP wish the tournament every success and are delighted we could find a way to work with the USTA to achieve this outcome.” “USTA Southern is thrilled to be bringing professional tennis back to Atlanta,” said Rex Maynard, President, USTA Southern Section. “When the sport works together in a collaborative fashion, great things happen. With our vibrant member base, and the overall appeal of tennis throughout this great region, we are convinced this event will be a great success.” “We are very pleased with the ATP board’s decision to award this event to Atlanta,” said Lucy S. Garvin, USTA Chairman of the Board and President. “A healthy professional tennis schedule in the U.S. sparks interest in the game and helps us to fulfill our mission of growing the sport on every level.”
